Subject: 2018 Racial Profiling Report and Statistical Analysis

To the Honorable Mayor Coulam and Distinguished Members of the City Council,

Texas State law requires that any police department that routinely perform traffic stops or motor vehicle stops where a citation is issued or an arrest is made submit a Racial Profiling Report to the State each year. This report contains the racial/ethnic designation of those stopped, whether a consensual or non-consensual search of the vehicle was conducted, whether contraband was found, and if so what type of contraband. The report must also include whether a warning was given, a citation or ticket was issued, an arrest was made and if any force resulting in injury was used during any arrest made.

SB1849, which went into effect on January 1, 2018, further requires that in addition to the Racial Profiling Report, an agency that submits such a report also submit a statistical analysis of its motor vehicle stops compared to the gender and ethnic population of the agency's reporting area, and the report must also contain a statement as to if any racial profiling complaints were made against the agency and if so, a listing of all racial profiling complaints and the corresponding resolutions. SB1849 further requires that the Chief Executive Officer of the submitting agency provide the governing body over the agency a copy of these reports.

Please find attached a copy of the Racial Profiling Report submitted to the State of Texas by the Todd Mission Police Department as well as a copy of the statistical analysis report that was submitted as required by SB1849.

Todd Mission Police Department has adopted a detailed written policy on racial profiling. Our policy:

- 1.) clearly defines acts constituting racial profiling;
- 2.) strictly prohibit peace officers employed by the Todd Mission Police Department from engaging in racial profiling;
- 3.) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the Todd Mission Police Department if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the Todd Mission Police Department has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4.) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5.) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the Todd Mission Police Department who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the Todd Mission Police Department's policy adopted under this article;
- 6.) require collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - a.) the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - b.) whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search; and
 - c.) whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before

detaining that individual; and

7.) require the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision(6) to:

a.) the Commission on Law Enforcement; and

b.) the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

2018 Statistical Analysis of Motor Vehicle Stops Conducted by the Todd Mission Police Department

The following is a statistical analysis of its motor vehicle stops compared to the gender and ethnic population of the agency's reporting area and a statement as to if racial profiling complaints were made against the agency and if so, a listing of all racial profiling complaints and the corresponding resolutions.

The City of Todd Mission would be considered the “reporting area” for this agency. However, since the City is comprised of such a small population and relatively small geographic area for Census Data collection, I have included two other expanded areas that give a broader population makeup that could be encountered in the City of Todd Mission. In the following charts, I used the 2010 Census Data for the City of Todd Mission, the overall ZIP code of 77363 which is comprised mostly of the entire Southeast region of Grimes County to include the City of Todd Mission and the City of Plantersville to the North, and also the City of Magnolia which is the largest city to the South of Todd Mission.

*In the 2010 Census Data used to compile this statistical analysis, the ethnic designation of Hispanic was included in the total count for the racial makeup of White. The 2010 census data then lists a separate break down of the % of population that reported as being Hispanic. For purposes of analysis, data collected for TMPD traffic stops was altered to match how the 2010 Census Data is reported, so in the chart above, Hispanic ethnic designation was also included in the total White racial makeup so that the % reported would match the Census Data.

It should be noted that HB3051 that became law on September 1, 2017, changed the definition of “race or ethnicity” to mean the following categories only:

Alaska Native or American Indian;
Asian or Pacific Islander;
Black;
White; and
Hispanic or Latino

The revised definition removed any Middle Eastern requirement when determining the race or ethnicity of someone who was stopped. (Art 2.132(a)(3) Texas Code of Criminal Procedure and Sec. 543.202(a) Texas Transportation Code.)

The Todd Mission Police Department, when determining the race or ethnicity included those of Middle Eastern descent into the category of Asian when collecting Racial Profiling Data on traffic stops.

*Reasons for search are listed as: Consent (given by person stopped); Contraband in plain site; Probable Cause or Reasonable Suspicion; Inventory search of vehicle as a result of towing; Incident to Arrest. In our case, all three searches were done after consent was given by the person stopped.

**Contraband Found is broken into the following categories: Illegal drugs/drug paraphernalia; Currency; Weapons; Alcohol; Stolen Property; Other. In each case above, it was drug paraphernalia (pipes) that was found each time – citations issued, no physical arrest.

The Todd Mission Police Department did not receive any complaints from any citizen alleging that they had been the subject of Racial Profiling during the reporting period of January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. For this reason, there are no complaints or corresponding resolutions to be reported.
